

Dear Friends,

The Methodist Church have just updated their website with the following:

*"It is with sadness that we recommend that worship services in Methodist Churches are suspended for the time being in line with Government guidance. We would encourage people who lead services to think about how worship might be offered in different ways, including online and using [worship at home sheets](#).*

*During this incredibly difficult time when people might want to spend time in prayer in their Methodist Church. Local trustees should consider whether it is possible to open up their churches to enable people to come and pray or sit quietly, perhaps offering prayer stations as a point of reflection with precautions around physical distancing."*

We need to take this seriously in order to care for each other. I am therefore making the decision that worship will be cancelled in all Methodist churches from today. This should also apply to St Francis and United, and to the united services at Landford, but there may be additional / different advice that also needs to be taken into account.

The means that Methodist preachers and ministers will not be leading the services planned on the Plan from tomorrow. Ministers and Stewards / Church Leadership Teams will be considering how to respond to this desert experience locally. When the Circuit website is available again, worship resources will be uploaded so all preachers are encouraged to consider how to contribute. We'll do some more thinking about this as soon as we can.

In the meantime, churches which are large enough to make physical distancing possible, and where no one is being put at risk, can consider whether it is possible to open up the church to enable people to pray. I would be grateful if the ministers could lead this discussion - via email / phone. However, no one should feel compelled to do this. It is dependent on you having appropriate physical space and the people to staff it. There is new safeguarding advice on the Methodist website and this should be adhered to.
