Sermon

The 11 chapters of John feature celebration, healing, feeding and restoration of life itself. I have chosen as my text John 10; 10

"I have come in order that you might have life – life in all its fullness"

4 incidents in this section of John illustrate this text

1.The wedding at Cana

You will know the story well. It is the start of Jesus' ministry, and he is invited with his mother to a big village wedding. Disaster happened when the wine ran out and his mother pleaded with him to help. The 6 large water jars (used for ritual washing). were now empty. Jesus got the servants to fill them with water which then became wine and the best wine at that! He turned the imperfections of the law into the perfection of his grace. When God's grace comes to men and women there is enough to spare for all. Become a follower of Jesus and there will be a change in your life, like turning water into wine

2 The Samaritan woman at the well

On a journey to Galilee, Jesus had to pass through Samaria ("foreign" territory). He was hot, tired and thirsty and so rested on a wall beside a well. A samaritan woman approached to get some water and Jesus asked her for a drink, She was astonished (a Jew asking a samaritan and a man talking to a woman.). There was a discussion and Jesus said that he could give her life-giving water that would never run out. She left her water jar and went back to the town and said "Come and see the man who

has told me everything I have ever done. Could he be the Messiah?"

3. <u>Feeding the 5000</u> You will know the story of the boy who shared his lunch of fish and bread, and Jesus miraculously enabled the disciples to use it to feed 5000. The point I want to emphasise here is that when it was over they collected up 12 baskets full of bread that was left. Again this illustrates the abundance that Jesus gives in life when we commit ourselves to him

4. <u>Mary anointing Jesus at Bethany</u> As probability of arrest closed in on him, Jesus spent an evening at Bethany, just outside Jerusalem. It was at the home of friends, Lazarus, Martha and Mary. The evening is remembered by Mary's extra ordinary action. She undid her hair (never done in public) and used her hair to wipe an expensive ointment over Jesus feet. This action provoked anger and opposition (typified by Judas) They were all against her except Jesus. He recognised that she, unknowingly, was anointing his body against his death. A ceremony that normally comes after death and in the tomb. Mary showed lavish generosity to express her love for Jesus. Unconsciously, she is mirroring his total generosity in dying on the cross for us all. Her action calls us to look again at our generosity in service to Jesus.

- 5 But we make his love too narrow by false limits of our own; and we magnify his strictness with a zeal he will not own.
